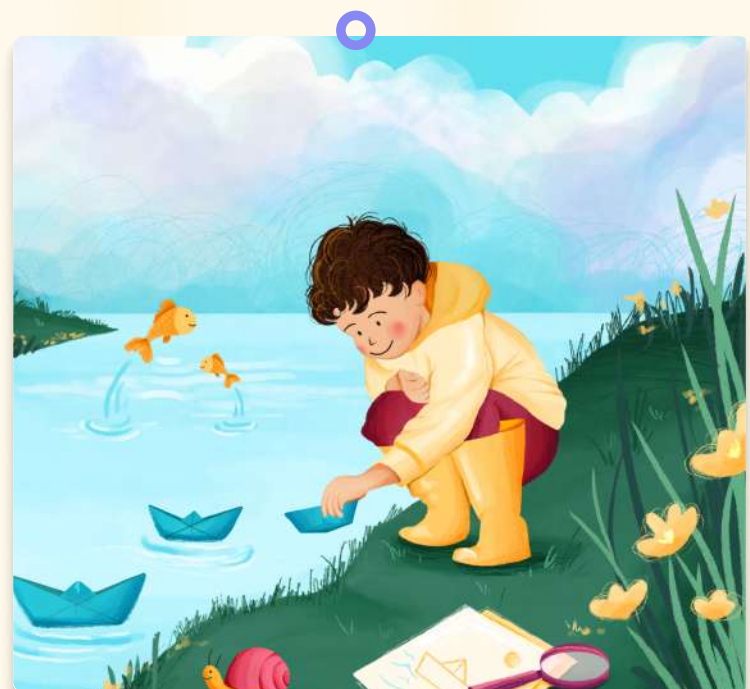
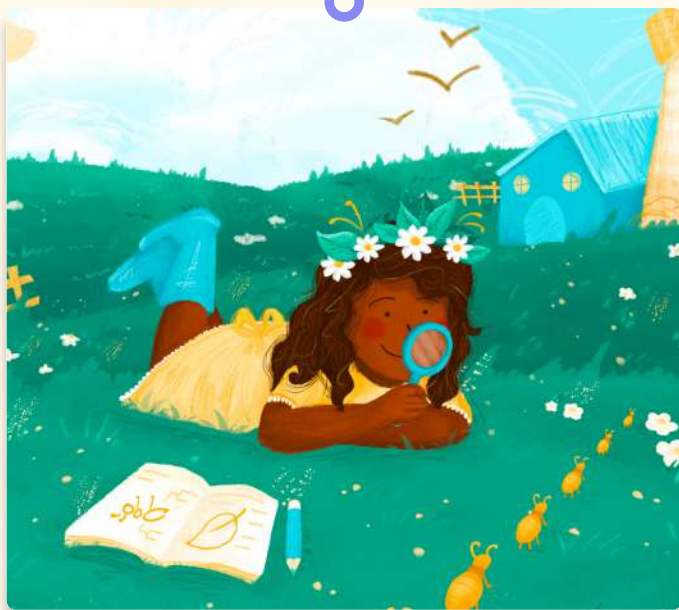

- 3 Just print and pen your message- easy peasy!

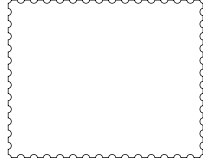
